# **LONG TERM CONDITION REVIEWS**

If you have a Long-Term Condition (LTC) you may remember the nurses like to review you during the month of your birthday. We also have our new blood pressure machine which patients can use to measure their 6 monthly interim blood pressure reading.

You might also receive a message from the surgery to supply us with a current up to date reading, so come to the foyer and if you need help with the machine just ask one of the team.

### **NEW PRESCRIPTION CHARGES**



Prescription (per item): £9.65 3-month prepayment certificate (PPC): £31.25 12-month prepayment certificate (PPC): £111.60

If you have to pay for four or more prescription items in three months, or more than 14 items in 12 months, you may find it cheaper to buy a PPC. Telephone advice and order line for PPC 0300 330 1341



# ON HRT AND PAY FOR PRESCRIPTIONS?



From 1 April 2023, women prescribed HRT will have access to a new scheme enabling them to purchase a yearly HRT-only pre-payment certificate (PPC) for the cost of 2 single prescription charges (as of April 2023 £19.30).

It can be used against a <u>list of HRT prescription</u> items, and a there will be no limit to how many times the certificate can be used while it is valid. Women will need to apply for the PPC through the NHS Business Services Authority or in person at a pharmacy registered to sell PPCs. Once it has been granted, it will be available for use immediately. The HRT PPC is in addition to the existing help with prescription charges, including the 3 and 12 month PPCs.

For people who need multiple medicines, the existing PPCs may remain a more cost-effective method of paying for prescriptions. Telephone advice and order line for PPC 0300 330 1341
